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Jockey Club Sarah Roe School - 'A Hidden Gem'

Tucked away in the leafy Homantin area of Kowloon and unknown to many, the Jockey Club Sarah Roe School (JCSRS) is one of the true jewels in Hong Kong's education system. Dedicated to children aged five to nineteen with special educational needs, the school is the only one of its kind under the English Schools Foundation (ESF) umbrella.

Founded in 1985, it owes its unusual name to the Hong Kong Jockey Club, who provided the school building and Ms Sarah Roe, an occupational therapist, who worked with children with special needs in Hong Kong.

The staff includes eight specialist teachers, a PE teacher, six therapists and a team of educational assistants, work together to tailor the curriculum to suit each student.

Classes range from seven to ten students; each having an individual education plan, enabling staff to meet individual needs.
