We wanted our product to make a difference to the lives of ALL individuals, so we contacted the foremost authority on Dyslexia research - the British Dyslexia Research Trust to advise and guide us with the development.

Q. Why did you develop the Neurodiverse City & Guilds edition?

A. Assessors informed us that they were recommending our software because they really believed it would make a difference to their students but they found that because it wasn't a 'quick fix', some students would start but not complete the course. To address this issue we decided to incentivise students by validating the course and awarding all successful students with digital credentials from a globally recognised body.
